The Hampton Court Chapel Royal choir is made up of boy Choristers and Gentlemen. The choir sings at services on Sundays and Holy Days throughout the year. It is part of the ecclesiastical establishment of the Royal Household and Her Majesty The Queen provides a Director of Music and Organist so that all who wish to worship in Her Chapel Royal may enjoy this unique choral heritage.

The Choristers are recruited from the widest range of schools across South West London and Surrey. The Choral Foundation funds an outreach programme and the musical education of every boy so that talented boys from any background may have this life changing opportunity to become a Chapel Royal chorister.

Local boys aged 7 to 9 years old (in School Years 3 to 5) may register for the family-friendly open day that takes place each September. Boys who have attended the open day may apply for an audition. Voice trials are held each October with up to 6 places available annually. The Director of Music teaches 20 boys in weekly rehearsals with up to 6 candidates on the waiting list at any one time. Those successful in audition may expect to join the choir within a year, and to train for at least 6 months before singing in services.

As this is not a choir school, boys stay at their usual school and attend rehearsals at Hampton Court twice a week; Tuesdays 17.00 to 18.10 and Fridays 18.00 to 19.15

Boys begin training as *Pre Probationers* attending evening rehearsal only. Once they are ready to sing in services they become *Probationers*. Eventually they will be promoted to *Choristers* and in due course may become a senior, known as a *Corner Boy* or indeed *Head Boy* or *Senior Head Boy*. All promotions are at the discretion

of the Director of Music and are made to the boy who shows musicality and maturity worthy of such a position.

Once singing in services the commitment is as follows:-

Sundays 09.30 rehearsal 11.00 service  
14.15 rehearsal 15.30 service

The services are in school term times only, with allowances for half terms, except for Holy days such as Christmas and Easter which fall in school holidays. Boys sing with the choir until the age of 13 years or until their voice changes, whichever is the sooner. Boys receive a small weekly payment, music lessons are funded by a non-means tested bursary, further means tested support is available and parents are provided with a car park pass for the choir schedule.

In addition to weekly services, the choir sings at prestigious concert venues; other Royal Chapels; to commemorate Royal and National events; it also undertakes recordings and TV and radio broadcasts.

Boys with treble voices from every culture who respect the form of worship in Her Majesty's Chapel Royal according to *The Book Of Common Prayer* are welcome. There are no academic requirements; you need not have musical grades or a trained voice. The Director of Music is looking for a pure high voice that will blend with the choir and an excellent musical ear. Boys with talent and potential, as well as those with previous musical experience, will have an equal opportunity to progress within choir and to receive any additional support that they require. Choral Scholarships to senior schools, such as Hampton School are available at 11 and 13.


